# Rush Definitions

---

**Rush** - The period of time in which a fraternity house or organization may pursue prospective students. All rush rules apply during functions and other activities during this period. Rush begins at Wabash on Friday of Honor Scholar Weekend, continues through the summer at Rush Parties and concludes by Wednesday of Freshmen Orientation Week in August.

**Bid** - A formal invitation to a prospective student to join a fraternity. Once given a bid, a prospective student has three options: accept, hold, or decline.

**Accept** - A binding decision to join that house upon matriculating. An accept is an agreement by a prospective student to join that fraternity. A prospective student may only accept one bid and therefore should be sure of his decision before accepting.

**Hold** - A decision by the prospective student to take a period of time to consider the offer to join. Prospective students may hold from the moment when they receive the bid until the fraternity closes its pledge class. After the pledge class is closed, any bids which are not confirmed as accepted or declined become void. If a prospective student desires to think about a bid from a fraternity, he should hold his bid and stay in contact with the fraternity rush chair.

**Decline** - A binding decision to decline a bid from a fraternity. Once a prospective student declines, the extended bid becomes void.

**Closed Pledge Class** - A declaration by a fraternity that they have ended their rush period and are giving out no more additional bids. After closing the pledge class, no more bids can be extended or accepted. After closing the pledge class, rush has officially ended for that house and it is no longer sanctioned by those rules governing the process.

**Dry Rush** - During rush, certain weekends and dates are designated as "dry" by Wabash College and the IFC. All functions during the period of Rush must be completely alcohol free and all participants--brothers, members, and prospective students--must comply.

**Dirty Rush** - A member of a fraternity or a fraternity in general speaking badly of another fraternity or making actions that disparage another fraternity in the presence of a prospective student. Dirty rushing is prohibited and should be reported to the IFC if suspected.

# ΛΧΑ *Lambda Chi Alpha*

In 1918, the Alpha-Kappa chapter of Lambda Chi Alpha opened its doors to the students of Wabash College. However, the rich history of Lambda Chi Alpha did not start with just the actual chapter. In fact, the “chapter” was around just over two decades before. The “barbarians” were never a formal organization, but when they began in 1892, they set into motion the ideals and events that would eventually lead to the building of a solid foundation on which the house today stands.

On May 20, 1918, the first 27 undergraduates of Lambda Chi Alpha were initiated to be members of the newly found house.

The brothers and their traditions moved to different locations around Crawfordsville before making their permanent residence at 515 W. Jennison; but with each site, the fraternity worked around it and make it their own.

Whether it was throwing a party, hosting a dance, excelling academically, or playing ball on the IM courts, the men that have become members of Lambda Chi Alpha all hold onto the ideals which the house and Wabash both hold dear. Since the day the chapter first opened its doors, over 1300 Wabash men have proudly called themselves Lambda Chi Alphas.
