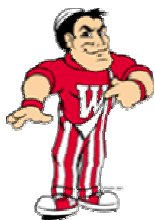
Fraternity Partnerships

Phi Gamma Delta - The new FIJI house, currently under construction in the lot just south of the present FIJI house, is well on its way to completion. The students fully anticipate being able to move into the new digs in August 2006.

Phi Kappa Psi - The Phi Psi renovation project is set to begin this coming March after Honor Scholar Weekend. The current undergrads will continue to occupy the house for the remainder of the spring semester during the initial stages of construction, but will be required to vacate the premises following the end of classes in May. Work will continue throughout the summer and fall with plans to be completed when the students return from semester break in January 2007. The Phi Psis will find temporary housing in the form of the old FIJI house during the fall semester of 2006.

Tau Kappa Epsilon - The TEKE renovation project has hit an unexpected snag, but talks continue between the College and the TEKE Housing Corp to seek a solution to the dilemma.

Kappa Sigma - The Kappa Sigs are finding it difficult to stay within budget as they review plans for renovation or new construction, but just as with the TEKE project, talks will continue and a solution will be found.

Football – The Little Giant Football team finished up another great season last fall and regained the Monon Bell, but lost to Capital University in the playoffs. Wabash quarterback Russ Harbaugh was named to AFCA Division III All-Star team and helped lead the US team to a victory over the Mexican National Team in the Aztec Bowl in December.

Basketball – Wabash basketball team is off to an 11-6 start (5-3 in the NCAC) and is looking forward to a strong performance this season.

Wrestling – In spite of a mediocre 7-7 dual meet record, the Little Giant Wrestling team vaulted to a 15th place ranking in the most recent NWAC poll due to recent victories over several other ranked teams.

Swimming – The Wabash Swim team is off to a slow start with a 3-5 record, but expects to pick up the pace for the remainder of the season.
