It is with sadness I report the deaths of **JAMES K. KERLIN** and **DR. NICHOLAS N. GREENBAUM**.

JAMES KEELTY KERLIN passed away at home in Tulsa, OK, September 24, 2016, after a long struggle with COPD. Jim graduated from high school in 1953, served in the U.S. Army from 1954 - 1956 and received his B.A. in 1962 from the University of Tulsa. Jim is survived by his wife, Jean, of 54 years; his son and daughter-in-law, his daughter and other relatives and friends.

NICHOLAS NEIL GREENBAUM died at the University Medical Center of Princeton in Plainsboro, New Jersey, November 7, 2016. Neil earned his PhD after Wabash from Rutgers University and retired from the College of New Jersey in 2010, where he was professor of mathematics for over 40 years. He is survived by his wife, Yvonne; his son and daughter-in-law, their children, family and friends.

THE DALLAS MORNING NEWS reported several weeks ago, announcing the death of STAN HUNTSMAN, age 84, a 1954 graduate of Wabash College. Stan was the head track coach for The University of Tennessee and then The university of Texas at Austin. Stan also coached the men's USA Olympic track team.
