Many Miler 55th Reunion is June 3-5, 2016! Mark it on your calendars!!!

November 14, 2015. What a gorgeous day for a football game! The stands were full, save for the extra bleachers on the Danny side. Probably more Wabash fans in Greenydingle than DePauw had. But they had a very good season (8-2) and had they won, they would have gotten the automatic playoff bid for NCAC. So, a lot at stake. They were missing some starters, so while they were highly ranked for rushing defense earlier in the season, Mason Zurek ran for 39 trips gaining



288 yards, an all-time record for Wabash. (I could only think about Jay Moore and Mike Hughes and how the amount of running they did caused a lot of pain in their knees in later life!) The Thursday dinner in Indy, now coined "The Spirit of the Monon Bell" gig, was well attended but no longer incudes any DePauw people (their choice.) Very nice affair at the Skyline Club with a great view of downtown Indy!

In the first game of the football playoffs, Wabash hosted Albion at Barney Hollett stadium on 11/21. In a blizzard, the game was slow in first half so they took 50+ minutes to scrape off the snow. Zurek ran for 314 yards which Wabash won 35-14 after blanking them in the second half. The next playoff game was also at Barney Hollett Stadium against Thomas More College in KY. Very close, hard fought game ending in a tie. On the first play of overtime, Wabash sacked the QB and scooped up his fumble to run 45 yards for a final of 33-27. The boys awarded the game ball to the man who scraped off the snow during half time!

The next week was something else! University of St. Thomas in St. Paul. (10,000 students!) Wabash never really got on track, losing 7-38. What a great season!!! 12-1. Mason Zurek (3.89 GPA headed for law school) is the North Region Div III offensive player of the year, and Coach Erik Raeburn is Coach of the year. If you have a few minutes, go to Wabash.edu and look up Liz Raeburn's Chapel Speech before the game! Good stuff.

Max Servies is ranked #9 in DivIII coaching wins in wrestling with 487. There are still a couple of active coaches ahead, but we're proud of Max. His legacy is on-going with a fantastic program which will soon have its own practice facility. The Wrestling Center will sit directly south of the indoor tennis courts and directly west of the Knowling Fieldhouse.

By now you probably have heard that Tom Runge '71 is retiring from Wabash in March. He has set the bar so very high during his 15 years as director of Alumni and Parent Relations. Of course, he reimagined reunions with the Big Bash weekend (1st during our 45th) which was a big gamble at the time, but how it has paid off big time... hard to imagine the old days when reunions were held during Commencement and Homecoming weekends!

Tom also instigated the Alumni Recruitment program, which results in over 1000 referrals each year. There is a MUCH higher chance of matriculation with alumni referrals. I think John Birdzell has probably brought in more Region guys than anyone else in our class. Keep up the good work. A Wabash Man may be lurking in your neighborhood! Wabash tuition this year is \$37,100, plus approximately \$9,200 for room, board, and fees. About 90% of all students receive some financial aid. 98% of faculty members hold a PhD or terminal degree in their fields. Student/Faculty ratio is 11/1 and the average class size is 13. Jay Moore and I and one other junior had a great class in Oral Interpretation with Charlie Scott. It was a great class and I wish I had kept the text!

It was my honor and privilege to represent President Hess at the Inauguration of John Pistole (TSA fame) as the fifth president of Anderson University. I remember watching John play as a very tall and highly accurate free throw shooter for the Anderson Indians. He rose up to be the Number Two man at the FBI before Obama appointed him to the TSA Directorship. John is a very quiet and humble guy who has accomplished a bunch. It will be interesting to see how he pulls Anderson U thru their 100th anniversary in '17 and beyond. The speaker was Jim Cromey the current Director of FBI. (Cromey is even taller than Pistole @ 6'9") Barbara grew up with John's older sister. Amazing that AU has only had 5



presidents in 100 years, and only a few people, including Barbara, can say that they have known all of them. Morrison was president for 49 years, so Barbara was only 11 but remembers him. Bob Reardon was a neighbor and his daughter is a close friend. Bob Nicholson directed the choral music for many years (I knew him well from Rotary) and Jim Edwards was in school when Barbara was a student. It was an awesome experience to march between Hanover (1827) and Franklin (1834) as the academic procession is by year of founding... Harvard was not there, but Yale and Princeton had representatives. DePauw chose not to participate!!! Thank you, Greg!

During meetings at Homecoming, I sat with Bob Wedgeworth'59. Wedgie was showing off his wrist watch. His mother had given it to him when he came to Wabash. He wore it all thru college and beyond. Last year he came across it in a drawer. He wound up sending it to Europe
