Dear Men of '65,

I received a letter from Tom Runge asking me to help out with our fiftieth reunion. In response, I called Tom and asked what he would like for me to do. He replied that he'd like for me to return as class agent. I have done so. Jacob is older and driving himself and has become much more responsible. I have had a two-year hiatus from Wabash activities and feel refreshed and even eager to get back to these activities.

Of course, I wouldn't have made a decision to return without talking to Jay. He was happy that I should renew these obligations. By my returning as class agent, he was able to step down from his responsibilities, which he would not have done otherwise out of his sense of obligation to the Class of '65. Jay is having some challenges to deal with in his own life. Specifically, his wife Jan has been diagnosed with lung cancer, and Jay naturally wanted to be free to attend to her needs. On May 16, I received the following up-date from him:

Our oncologist gave us the report from yesterday's CTscan and it showed: (1) The cancer in the right lung and lymph nodes is shrinking; and (2) there is no evidence that the cancer is spreading to other locations....We will continue with frequent blood tests and weekly visits with the oncologist. Jan's fourth and last regular chemo session is scheduled for June 6. Then the oncologist and the surgeon will decide what comes next. We hope and pray Jan will then be in a position to have surgery to remove the last of the cancer.

I also spoke with Allan Anderson who feels we shall do well on our class gift at the reunion. I am sure you will hear from him as our reunion approaches.

If you are flying in <u>please</u> practice the second verse of Old Wabash. And ask someone else to drive if you are driving in, so you can practice the second verse. We will be singing both verses at the Chapel Sing. Bob Witherspoon will be our conductor.

The Class of 1965 will rent the hospitality suite located in the Holiday Inn Express. The address is 2506 Lafayette Road, Crawfordsville, IN 47933. Men who wish to stay at the Holiday Inn Express should plan to reserve their sleeping room in the hotel not later than January or February of 2015. Those who have been back to Crawfordsville within the last 5 years or so know that this hotel is one of the nicest of all. I'm fairly sure that if edits are made they will be shared with the author prior going to press. During Phil Young's talks with other classes the "Memory Book" has been the most popular and sought after publication.
