The Class of 1966 captured the following (which were all of them):

- Of course, Chapel Sing ... with the fireworks. (As an aside, Jon Pactor (1971 Class Agent) has engineered the Class of 1971 duel with our Class for winner of the Chapel Sing at each 5 year reunion. Each time the Class of 1966 has beaten the Class of 1971. Each time, the competitive ante (complexity) went up. This year Jon remarked before the event that he had a secret weapon to win against the Class of 1966 this year. He was told to give it up ... as long as the Class of 1966 was breathing, 1971would be second. Jon was sitting near one of our Class wives during our part of the Sing competition.
