Enrollment and Facilities

President Hess has announced a plan to grow Wabash by increasing enrollment up to 1,000. It will be done by expanding freshman classes beginning with next fall's class. It is believed the college can operate just as efficiently at this level as it does now with about 900 enrolled. In fact, the added enrollment might increase revenues if there's an increase in those who can pay tuition as opposed to those who need financial aid. New housing for Independents is projected to be built west of Crawford St. Since Martindale was the last dorm built some 52 years ago (you remember that wonderful new dorm when we were Freshmen), new housing is a necessity to help attract prospective students and replacing aging structures. The complex is planned to be multiple units and provide 150 beds.

Athletics

TRACK AND FIELD. Wabash set a new record for total points to capture its fourth consecutive league title at the 2014 North Coast Athletic Conference Indoor Track and Field Championships at Denison University, earlier this month.

The Little Giants became the first team to score more than 250 points. Wabash won the nine-team men's competition with a total of 256 points, easily outdistancing Ohio Wesleyan in second place with 142 points. Allegheny took third place with 63 points, followed by Wittenberg (49), Oberlin (47), DePauw (46), Denison (43), Wooster (31), and Kenyon (25).

Wabash set the previous high mark by scoring 238 points at the 2012 championship meet. The Little Giants have topped 200 points each of the last four

seasons. The Little Giants expanded their lead from Friday afternoon's first day of competition with a strong performance in Saturday's field events.

The Wabash coaching staff earned NCAC Coach of the Year honors for the fourth consecutive year for the efforts in preparing the Little Giants for their conference championship. http://sports.wabash.edu/news/2014/3/13/TRACK_0313145513.aspx

WRESTLING. Wabash enjoyed a record-setting day at the 2014 NCAA Division III Midwest Wrestling Regional, comprised of twelve teams. Six Little Giants qualified for the Nationals after finishing in the top-three in their individual weight classes.

Conner Lefever and his younger brother, Riley, each captured individual titles to earn their place at the DIII Championships in Cedar Rapids, Iowa March 14-15. Josh Sampson and Tommy Poynter earned second-place finishes. Reece Lefever and Austin O'Neal secured their places in the championship tournament with a pair of third-place finishes.

"What a tournament," Head Coach Brian Anderson said. "The guys came in and did what they expected to do. They believed in the process all year long and it paid off today. I am proud of the entire program's effort all year long and of our starters today." Anderson was named Regional Coach of the Year in a vote of the 12 head coaches, while Danny Irwin shared Assistant Coach of the Year honors with Whitewater's Chris Heilman.

At the NCAA finals, this past weekend, the team finished 9th and had two place winners - Reece Lefever placed 4th at 157# and brother Riley Lefever, a freshman, won the 184# championship and completed an undefeated season! <u>http://sports.wabash.edu/news/2014/3/15/WREST_0315144057.aspx</u>
