50th Reunion

I hope you are planning to be part of the celebration! It is not too early to start thinking about it. In fact, I am asking you to participate in three ways:

First and foremost – BE THERE! This is a great milestone for us and a wonderful opportunity to renew friendships, revisit your favorite haunts (altho most do not still exist – for example, The Lew is now a parking lot), and remember things that never happened. There is always a wide variety of reunion activities, as well as plenty of time to spend with classmates and other reunion attendees.

Second, Phil Coons is preparing a Memory Book for the occasion. A section of the book will be devoted to individual bios and we'd like everyone to contribute. We will include a format in future letters, but please start thinking about it now.

Third, is the Class Gift. We have not yet determined a specific target amount, but we would certainly like to exceed the current record of \$4.7 million. For the

purposes of this gift, we have five years to reach our goal. Our contributions from July 1 of 2012 (right after our 45th) through June 30 of 2017 count toward this Class Gift. As for types of gifts --- any and all single gifts, multi-year pledges, deferred gifts, annuities and trusts, and just about any other donation counts toward this Class Gift. In fact, now is a good time to send a check to Wabash and get a tax deduction for 2014!

College Facts

- + Endowment: As of March 31, 2014, the value of Wabash's endowment was approximately \$345 million, which places Wabash among the highest per-student endowment of all colleges in the nation.
- + Financial Aid: Approximately 90 percent of students receive some form of student aid.
- + Tuition and Fees: For the 2014-2015 academic year, tuition is \$37,100. Residence Hall room charges are \$4,530 per year (fees vary based on choice of living unit). Meal charges vary by meal plan, including \$4,600 (19 weekly meals) and \$4,200 (15 meals). The required Student Activity Fee is \$450 and there is a \$200 Student Health Center fee.
- + Student Body: Wabash's 902 students come from approximately 32 states and about 12 foreign countries; about 70 percent of the students are from Indiana. Each year approximately 250 Freshmen enroll, which is about to change as the College is aiming for 1000 students.
- + Test Scores: They range from the middle 50 percent of entering freshmen -- SAT critical reading 500-610, SAT math 530-640, and SAT writing 480-590, and average composite ACT is 25.
- + Faculty: In 2013, 98 percent of the faculty members at Wabash hold a Ph.D. or equivalent terminal degree. Wabash's special strength lies with a faculty dedicated to teaching undergraduate students; no graduate assistants. Student/Faculty Ratio is approximately 11 to 1 and average class size is 13.
