According to Grunge: "These efforts are taking nothing away from our liberal arts core and are adding real opportunities for additional student experiences and better professional development."

Wabash College President Greg Hess said his mission at Wabash can be summed as "trying to get better fast." He told the assembled Class Agent group that he envisioned Liberal Arts to be Challenging, Confrontational, and administered with Compassion to the student. He added a 4<sup>th</sup> C, to provide a Compass, which distinguished Wabash. He said the college has experienced a 6.25% draw on the endowment, which he hopes to reduce below 5% next year. Endowment management will be outsourced next year.

On the right is **Dudley Burgess '64** whom I see from time to time at Monon events in Denver. He guides tours of the Grand Canyon. Also, you see **Jim Hutcheson '68** who began his Wabash experience in Dudley's pledge class at the Beta House, and finished after a Vietnam Sabbatical.
