**MICHELLE L. JANSSEN NAMED DEAN FOR COLLEGE ADVANCEMENT** • July 1, 2014. Wabash College President Gregory D. Hess has announced the appointment of Michelle Janssen as the Dean for College Advancement. She will begin her tenure at Wabash on Friday, August 1. As the Dean for College Advancement, Janssen will oversee the Annual Giving, Major Gifts, Advancement Services, and Alumni and Parent Relations functions at the College. She brings nearly three decades of successful fund-raising experience to Wabash, most recently serving as Vice President of Alumni and College Relations at Berea College, in Berea, Kentucky.

I met Michelle. She seems knowledgeable and enthusiastic. She should do good things for Wabash! Berea College sounds like an interesting place. Look it up! But they hover around 14% Alumni giving, versus the 41% who support Wabash. Speaking of that, **Great job, guys! The class of 1968** has been in the "green" category of 40% or better since FY2004. We also are usually at the top of the "Unrestricted Giving" amount column. Last year we had 88 donors for \$389,784. Our annual goal is the "five-year high" which is 91 donors. So if we can get three more guys to throw in 20 bucks this year... we will look a tad better in the gift line. For the College, \$3,271,804 is the second highest Annual Fund dollar total behind FY13, the year that 1968 hit 91 donors.

The plan is to put up new independent housing there with 150 beds. The largest facility in the new housing complex is a Hall. The Hall will hold 40 students and cost roughly \$4,000,000. An idea surfaced which
