Our 50th Reunion – June 2019

Gentlemen of the Class of 69,

As a good year for Wabash College comes to an end, with finals and the holiday break only days away, we continue to be amazed what Wabash men accomplish. An outstanding football season came to an end this last Saturday (5 Dec) in St. Paul, MN with Wabash in the NCAA Division III quarter-finals against a strong St. Thomas team. Although Wabash lost 38-7 in a hard fought game we can be proud of Coach Raeburn and his exceptional team finishing 10-0 in the regular season, keeping the Monon Bell, defeating Albion and Thomas More in the playoffs, and completing a 12-1 season, the best since 2011 (also 12-1). Mason Zurek, the 2015 NCAC Offensive Player-of-the-Year, set a new Wabash single-season rushing record with 2,011 yards, second in the nation in total rushing. Named to the Academic All-American D3 Football First Team, he also set a new Wabash record of 23 TD's in a single season. Nine Wabash players were selected for the 2015 All-North Region Team. The fund's annual earned income on 30 June 2015, was \$ 9,540. This amount will be split between the two recipients. In the spring they will send our class a letter addressing their scholarship and Wabash experience. This is the third year our scholarship has been awarded, providing much needed financial assistance to six fine Wabash men. To all of you who have contributed to our Dean Moore Scholarship Fund over these past 11 years to make these awards possible I sincerely thank you, our Class of 69 thanks you, Wabash College thanks you. Good work!

The new student housing project is progressing well, with a scheduled move-in for the two large buildings set for early January at the start of the spring semester. In looking at the construction this past Sunday it

is hard to believe they will be completed on time. But many workers are on the job and the pace is intense. The two mid-size units (stone façade) will be completed by summer. The buildings and the architecture are impressive (pictures enclosed). Students will clear Martindale after finals leaving their things in the new large dorms before break. Demolition inside Martindale begins before Christmas with renovation to be completed early August, ready for the fall semester. Wabash housing will have a whole new look.

Talks on bringing back Delta Tau Delta to Wabash College are progressing. It is not a question of "if", but "when". Estimates are that it will happen sooner than later, probably within the next 12 to 18 months. Initially the house will probably be shared by Delts and independents, until the Delt population grows and all independent housing is completed. This fall the large maple tree on Wabash Ave in front of the Delt house had exceptionally beautiful colors (picture enclosed). Maybe the beautiful old maple is a sign of new things to come.

In my September letter I mentioned our Class of 69 has established a lasting legacy for our class and for Dean Moore by creating our Dean Moore Scholarship Fund. As we look at retirement and hopefully many more good years ahead we may begin to think of our own personal legacy and how we might wish to be remembered. There are many good options, one of which might be a deferred gift to Wabash through your estate planning, or a charitable remainder trust such as our classmate Dr. Ray Knight has set up with the sale of his 1951 Porsche Roadster.
