This year has passed all too quickly and now winter has descended upon us in the mid-west and northern states with the "Siberian Express", the double polar vortex, and a lot of artic air bringing "warm" greetings from Canada for the holidays. It may be time to move back to sunny southern California! Those of you in the warm areas of the US are fortunate to miss all this.

2016 was a good year for Wabash College: completing the beautiful Residential Life District on the west side of the campus; having a highly successful Day of Giving on 4/27; graduating in May the Class of 2016, with 32% receiving honors; completing the Martindale renovation on schedule; receiving a top-15 percent national ranking in 24 Wabash programs, which included a top-1 percent ranking in linguistics, German language, history, and mathematics. Wabash also received high ratings for its immersion programs, alumni relations, and career services.

Sports: The Wabash wrestling team is having a very good season. On December 8 they were ranked 2nd in the nation in Division 3. With the recently completed Shelbourne Wresting Center the Wabash wrestlers are making an outstanding showing for themselves and for Wabash College. The football team had a fair season, finishing 8-2 with a new football couch. Unfortunately we lost the Monon Bell to DePauw in a close game. Behind in the 4th quarter Wabash took the lead 34-30 with less than 2 minutes to play. DePauw came back connecting on a series of passes scoring a touchdown to go ahead 37-34 with less than 30 seconds. And so ended the 123d Monon Bell Classic with the Bell going to DePauw after seven good years at Wabash. We will get it back next year!

Living: On Saturday, October 22, the newly renovated Martindale Hall was rededicated with a well-attended ribbon cutting ceremony on a beautiful fall day with clear blue sky and colorful trees on campus (pictures). It was a good ribbon-cutting ceremony. The new building architecture and construction provide a truly unique living environment for students living in Martindale. The completion of Martindale and the new Residential Life District now provide superb living accommodations for the Wabash independents and is now a major factor in attracting prospective students. We extend a special thanks to all of you who have contributed to the Student Housing Fund.

On this October 22d Saturday the Phi Gamma Delta Fraternity celebrated the 150 year anniversary of its founding with a formal pig dinner. The Psi Chapter was established on campus in 1866. We congratulate the Fiji's for their many years of outstanding brotherhood at Wabash College.

Dean Moore Scholarship: The Scholarship Committee has selected two recipients for this year's Dean Moore Scholarship. Both are seniors. Michael Herrmann is a Lambda Chi from Coatsville, IN. Riley Sullivan is a Sigma Chi from Noblesville, IN. They will be sharing this year's scholarship of \$14,597, the fund's investment income earned as of June 30, 2016. This is a 53% increase over last year's scholarship of \$9,540. We congratulate these two gentlemen on the receipt of their scholarships and wish them well in their finals this week and comps the week of 9 January (only a few weeks away!). It is worth noting the historic (book) value of our Dean Moore Scholarship Fund on June 30, 2016, was \$361,970, which is up from the historic value of \$262,561 in June 2015.
