Baseball Heads To NCAA Tourney. Wabash heads to the NCAA baseball tournament for the first time by winning its first conference championship, April 30. The team, a third seed, defeated Ohio Wesleyan, 5-2 in the championship game and perennial national power, Wooster, 3-2 in the semi-finals. Wabash joined the North Coast Athletic Conference in 2000. The college dedicated a new baseball stadium this spring. Baseball is the oldest varsity sport at Wabash.

Wabash hires new basketball coach. Antoinette Carpenter '00 will become the new head basketball coach replacing his mentor and legend Mac Petty. Carpenter played along side perhaps the greatest Wabash shooter Josh Estelle. For the past four years, he was Coach Petty's assistant. He knows Wabash, he can coach, and he can recruit. He was an art major, so he ought to be able to draw up some nifty plays.

College Celebrates Earth Day. Students for Sustainability and the College's Environmental Concerns Committee celebrated Earth Day, on April 25, by expanding the one-year old Wabash Community Garden. They planted a new orchard and learned about upcoming plans for the garden.
