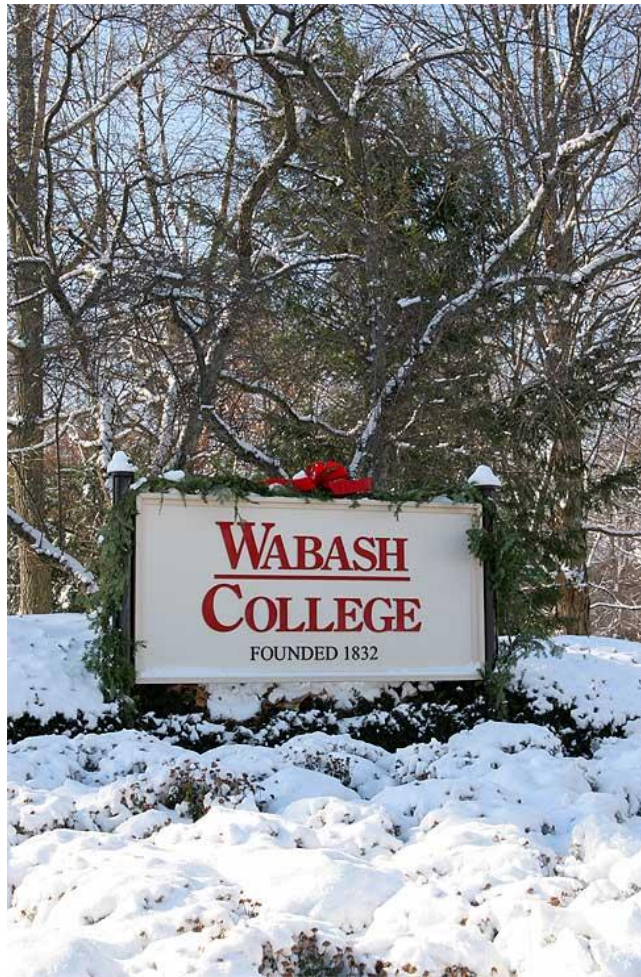


**Greetings, Class of 1973!**

Hopefully, you've been following events at the College for the current academic year – there is a lot going on.

The football team once again had a successful season, retaining the Monon Bell and making it to the second round of the D3 Playoffs before losing to UW-Whitewater, who will once again be playing Mount Union for the national championship. Wabash College senior defensive end Cody Buresh was honored by being named to the American Football Coaches Association 2014 Division III All-America Team, one of 25 NCAA DIII football players selected to the All-America team. This was in addition to also being named the D3football.com North Region Defensive Player of the Year – a huge accomplishment. Cody's brother Ethan, AJ Akinribade, and Tyler Holmes were all selected as members of the 2014 All-North Region Team as well.

At one point this Fall, Wabash had football, soccer, and cross-country all ranked within the Top 15 nationally.

Currently, Wabash wrestling has moved up to #2 in the D3 national ranking. My family and I have been able to attend a couple basketball games this year and are excited and positive about the changes we've observed under new head coach Kyle Brumett.

Senior Jacob Burnett has been named a Rhodes Scholar, the ninth in Wabash's history. He will be working towards his Master's Degree this Fall at Oxford University.

The most noticeable change on campus is what is happening along the west side of Crawford Street. New campus housing is being built to house 136 students. I believe plans are to have 2-16 bed lodge building completed and in use for Fall 2015, with the balance completed in 2016. Once students begin moving into the new housing, renovation of Martindale will begin.

For those of you living/working in the Crawfordsville area, the Sugar Creek Association of Wabash Men will be having Monthly Luncheons on a regular basis on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of each month at the Crawfordsville Country Club.

With the end of 2014 looming in the near future, I want to remind you all that these are the last days to make your annual gift to the college and still be able to take advantage of the Indiana tax credit.
