Season's Greetings Classmates!

On behalf of the entire Wabash College community, I want to wish you and your family the Happiest of Holidays and all the best in 2016!

A quick review of the past year shows the College yielded some tremendous results in 2015. Witness the following:

- 239 freshmen, representing 17 states and six Asian countries, comprise the Class of 2019. Naturally, the vast majority of that number (172 or 72%) comes from Indiana, although Admissions has made in-roads in Hawaii and Washington State and continues to recruit well in Arizona. Thirty members of this year's frosh class participated in Wabash's Summer Liberal Arts Immersion Program a month-long orientation/study program and earned one course credit.
- Two new residence halls are nearing completion on the west side of campus near the tennis complex and will be occupied during the upcoming second semester by students currently residing in Martindale Hall. Martindale will then undergo renovation and should be ready for next fall. You can get an aerial view the new residence halls on the College's home web page at <u>www.wabash.edu</u>.
- The College is working alongside the City of Crawfordsville in its "Poised for Transformation" program, which uses state and federal grant monies to pursue key strategic objectives. Wabash students are involved in a new fusion center to unite community development and other agencies to create various trails, gateways and parks.
- In fiscal year 2015, the College raised \$24 million, including over \$11 million in grants and foundation support. Over 41 percent of alumni contributed to a \$3.1 million Annual Fund, and about \$11.4 million in gifts and pledges has been raised for the new student housing projects. The value of the College endowment stands at approximately \$317 million.

• And, lastly, as most of you may know, the Little Giants captured the Monon Bell Classic for a record seven straight time with a convincing 45-17 shellacking of the Dannies in Greencastle. Wabash followed up that North Coast Conference championship-clinching victory with playoff wins over Albion and Thomas More before bowing out in the Division III quarterfinals at St. Thomas – to finish 12-1 overall.
