 25^{th} Reunion – 2015 is the year for our 25^{th} reunion. Next year's Big Bash will be held June 5-7. Here are our goals for the reunion: Thirteen class members attended the last reunion. Realistically, thirty-five of us should be able to make it back to Crawfordsville next year. This is a modest goal. A couple of years ago, the Class of '88 set a record for 25^{th} year reunions when sixty members attended. I think that we can exceed this number by *at least* two. This is an ambitious, but achievable, goal.

There is a **Donor Challenge** given to reunion classes by the College. If our class reaches its reunion goal of 50 donors (31.06%), then we will

have an open bar (instead of a cash bar) available to us during our class dinner on the Saturday of the Big Bash weekend. Since we achieved this number last year (see below), meeting the challenge should be an easy. The deadline for making a contribution is Wednesday, May 27th.

Registration for the Big Bash will begin on January 1, and updates will be made to the site between this date and the event itself. Also, the Class of 1990 has a meeting room set aside for us at the Hampton Inn and Suites, so please try to reserve your lodging here. If you call to reserve a room, ask for the Wabash rate discount.

Giving – Last year, the number of those giving to the Annual Fund reached 31% (a total of 50 class members, up from 45 in 2012-13), the highest percentage during the last decade. As I mentioned, our target for the reunion is 50 guys.
