# Wabash on Campus

The Board of Trustees of Wabash College, announced on January 26, 2013 that Gregory D. Hess has been elected the 16th president of Wabash College. Dr. Hess, who is currently the Dean of the Faculty and Vice President of Academic Affairs at Claremont McKenna College (CMC), will begin his responsibilities on July 1, and will follow Patrick E. White, who announced his resignation last May.

"Promoting and identifying Wabash College's distinctiveness as a 21st century liberal arts college for men is a critical element for the new president to articulate," Dr. Hess said. "Wabash needs to be known as an institution that understands the unique abilities and needs of young men, firmly grounds them in the liberal arts, and resolves to fully develop their cultural and skill-based competencies. #### **Accessing the Mobile Web Site**

The Wabash mobile web site is accessible from any device with a web browser, at **m.wabash.edu**. In most cases, if you visit the Wabash web site <u>www.wabash.edu</u> from a mobile device, you will be automatically redirected to the mobile site.



#### What's on the Mobile Web Site

The mobile web site provides easy access to the information you're most likely to need when on the go – news stories, events, campus map, directory information, and athletics information. It also offers easy access to admissions information (including a short form to refer a student), academic information, and campus office hours. #### What about an app?

The mobile web site provides functionality similar to an app, but is cross-platform and works the same on all mobile devices. It's easy to add the Wabash mobile site to your phone home screen, whether you have an iOS or android device. If you have an iPhone,

iPad, or iPod touch, click the button at the bottom of the browser screen, and click **Add to Home Screen**.
