Wabash's Chapter of Delta Tau Delta, Beta Psi Has Been Removed from Campus



As many of you may know by now, Delta Tau Delta has been kicked off of Wabash's campus following the death of Johnny Smith, a freshman pledge from Arizona.

Initially, pending the investigations by the international fraternity, the local authorities, and the college, activities at the house were suspended. Following the college's investigation, Dean Mike Raters '85 and President Pat White made the call to cancel the lease of the Delt Shelter and to turn the fraternity into a residence hall. All underclassmen under 21 years of age were allowed to stay if they wished, and all underclassmen of legal drinking age were required to move out and live

elsewhere. 2 resident assistants have been moved into the shelter.

What we do know about the incident itself is that a young man died from alcohol poisoning. The alcohol was not purchased by the house, nor was it at a house-sponsored event. The college's investigation moved President White and Dean Raters '85 (right) to conclude that there was a serious enough breach of the Gentleman's Rule from the fraternity practices in recruiting, through training, in pledgeship and ritual and tradition (rough paraphrase) to determine that there was an atmosphere of irresponsible citizen ship and ungentlemanly behavior. Though the proclamation was damning, to be sure, the possibility of Delta Tau Delta returning to campus around or after 2012 remains an item for discussion.



Many of you also know that this is not the first fatality caused by underage drinking on campus. This topic is now under intense discussion. I have personally been talking with the administration, with alumni affairs, and with Delts and non-Delts from all classes. It is an intense shock and disappointment to see the fraternity removed from campus. Many men have voiced emotions ranging from outrage, to sadness, to shame, and the answers that we all so desperately want are just not readily available at this time. What we do know is that Delta Tau Delta has a long history of successful leadership on campus, that its members have shaped the Wabash experience in many positive ways, and that its presence will be sorely missed by the college. It is a truly unfortunate situation.
