

Monon Bell Classic



The 121st game in the historic Depauw-Wabash football rivalry was held on Saturday, November 15, 2014. Wabash pushed the entire game to come out on top with a 23-7 victory over Depauw. This was the sixth straight victory which ties for the second longest Wabash win streak in the rivalry. The Little Giants won six in a row from 1949-1954, and set the record with seven wins in a row from 1921-1927. As you all know Bell is one of the biggest days on the Wabash calendar, and a lifelong memory for Little Giants football players.

Wabash College is ranked among the best national liberal arts colleges by U.S. News & World Report.

Ranked 61st nationally places Wabash in the top thirty percent of all 236 ranked schools. Schools are divided into two categories, Regional Universities and Regional Colleges, and then are further divided and ranked in four geographical groups. Up to 16 indicators of academic excellence are factors in choosing the best schools. This is yet another great accomplishment by the Wabash community!





Climbing for a cause

Ryan Bowerman '11 was part of a team that climbed Tanzania's Mount Kilimanjaro to raise money for Vision for the Poor, an international non-profit organization that provides treatment for blindness in developing countries. Mount Kilimanjaro has an altitude of over 19,000-feet and took four and a half days to climb. Ryan said that the journey was well worth it because they raised \$50,000 for Vision for the Poor. Because of this selfless act more than 200 children will have the opportunity to get surgery to prevent blindness.

Luke Messer '91 enters leadership position within the House GOP

Following his re-election by Indiana's sixth district on November 4th, Luke was elected to the No. 5 House GOP leadership slot; a position he said he will use to show Republicans can help working



families. The committee serves as an advisory panel to help House Republicans develop policy solutions. Messer majored in speech at Wabash and was also a member of the Little Giant football team.

Jacob Burnett '15 will become the ninth Wabash graduate to be named a Rhodes Scholar.



With the gracious support of Wabash College, Burnett is one of thirty-two students in the nation to be named a Rhodes Scholar. These thirty-two members are carefully selected from 887 well-qualified candidates, and will received funds to cover their education costs. Jacob will enroll at Oxford in the fall of 2015 to work towards his master's degree in Criminology and Criminal Justice. Burnett is the first Wabash Rhodes Scholar since Jeremy Robinson '04 won in 2005.

Wabash native becomes starting kicker for Purdue

Ian MacDougall '14 graduated from Wabash this spring with one year of athletic eligibility remaining. Ian decided to reach out to a couple coaches and it paid off because he walked on at Purdue, made the team and started the season kicking off against Western Michigan. Graduating from Wabash with a degree in history, Ian will pursue his master's at Purdue in Sports Management.

Gentlemen's Classic



It was a weekend packed with football and fellowship as two tradition-rich schools competed against each other on the football field. On Friday, September 5th Wabash welcomed a delegation from Hampden-Sydney College and its nationally ranked football team for a convocation in the Pioneer Chapel. There were over 200 football players, 400 students, alumni, faculty, staff, and trustees from both colleges in attendance. The college also welcomed featured guest, NCAA President Park Emmert. On Saturday, Dr. Emmert was

present on the field for the coin flip before the game. Wabash prevailed in the game with a rousing 34-21 victory in front of nearly 5,000 Wabash fans. Just a reminder that on Saturday, September 5th 2015 the Little Giants will travel to Farmville, Virginia to complete the home-and-home series. It would be great if we could pack the stands with Wabash fans and show our ongoing support for the Little Giants football program.

Cross Country

The Little Giants cross country team pushed through falls early in the competition to finish 16th at the 2014 NCAA Division Ill Cross Country Championships. Notable runners included freshman Colin Rinne, top finisher for Wabash, who took home 94th place out of 280 runners. Just behind Colin
