### **Four Milestone Goals**

- 1) Demonstrate and articulate the value of a Wabash liberal arts education;
- 2) Extend the academic and geographic footprint of the college;
- 3) Emphasize leadership development in each Wabash man; and
- 4) Enhance the culture of philanthropy

Hess states these goals will be reached, and the implementation of the following initiatives will take us closer to that day:

#### Initiatives

- 1) **Global Health Initiative-** Students immersing themselves in global health public education, investigation, and service.
- 2) **Democracy and Public Discourse Initiative**-Students and the community using the power of public discourse to work through and solve controversial issues
- 3) **Business and Entrepreneurship Initiative**-Encouraging students to connect their liberal arts education with experience in entrepreneurship, business, and public service
- 4) **Digital Arts and Human Values Initiative-**Understanding the importance digital media has on our age and how we can engage students and leverage it's unlimited possibilities

### New Dean for College Advancement

Earlier this month, President Hess announced the appointment of Michelle L. Janssen as the Dean of College Advancement.
