The 2014 fiscal year has seen a record of giving to the Wabash College Annual Fund. Over \$3.2 million in unrestricted donations for the second year in a row. Over 5,200 donors contributed to the fund, which was over 500 new donors since this past year. Over 4,300 of these donors were alumni, so I say again, gentlemen, thank your for your generosity! He will be coordinating the College's residence life, and will also be responsible for policies and living conditions within the independent men's residence halls, fraternities, and student houses owned by the College. Welch is a 1999 graduate, and since 2012, he has served as the Wabash Secondary Licensure in the Education Studies department. Welch studied Spanish and Psychology, graduated Magma Cum Laude, while also earning induction into Phi Beta Kappa. He earned his M.A.T. in Spanish in 2006 from Indiana University.





Wabash on Princeton's Best List

In a recent published article by the Princeton Review, Wabash College was named one of the best colleges for undergraduate education. Inclusion in the Princeton Review's "Best 378 Colleges" means that Wabash ranks among the top 15 percent of 2,500 U.S.-based four-year colleges. Wabash polled extremely well in class room experience, professor accessibility, athletics, and recreation. Finally, the Wabash campus was ranked as the

nation's easiest campus to get around. The 60-acre wooded campus contains 25 buildings predominantly of Georgian architecture. Caleb Mills taught the first class of Wabash students in 1833 in Forest Hall, located since 1965 at the north end of campus.

The Gentleman's Classic

The Gentleman's Classic is this coming weekend (!), taking place September 6th, in Crawfordsville. Interesting fact, despite the individual success for the Little Giants and the Hampden-Sydney College Tigers throughout the years, this will be the first meeting between the two schools on the football field. Tickets for The Gentlemen's Classic will be sold at the entry gates to Hollett Little Giant Stadium on game day. Tickets are \$5 for adults and \$3 for students with a college ID and children. Wabash students may enter at no charge by showing their student ID. The game will also be streamed on Wabash's website at <u>www.wabash.edu/live</u>.

Monon Bell to air on AXS TV

For 10th consecutive year, one of the oldest college football's rivalries, the Monon Bell Classic, will be able aired across America on AXS TV. The 121st football game between Wabash College and DePauw University will take place Saturday, November 15, in Crawfordsville. It will be presented live beginning at 1 p.m. (EST).

Some fun facts for you: The Monon Bell Classic was voted Indiana's best college sports rivalry by fans of ESPN, and is noted in the DVD collection, ESPNU Honor Roll: The Best of College Football, as one of the nation's best annual clashes. The Monon Bell was featured on CBS' Sunday Morning and has twice been spotlighted in Sports Illustrated. Important to note that ticket information for the 121st Monon Bell Classic will be announced in September.



Turn it up! Morgan Motivates Returning Students



In healthy dose of enthusiasm and motivation last week, Track and Field Coach Clyde Morgan encouraged students to make this year the best it can be.

"If you don't feel like you're a great leader – no, make that a phenomenal leader – then I want you to leave."—Certainly words that grabbed attention!

He continued: "Last year was a pretty okay year at Wabash...But okay is not okay with me. We

have to be better than last year. (Other schools) can be okay but not Wabash."

Morgan shared qualities essential to being a great student leader. Among them was the important of self-discipline and character. He spoke of commitment:

"You can't be committed to be a phenomenal leader just when it's convenient...we don't want part-time commitment. We want commitment to this leadership team, commitment to Wabash and commitment to some kid."

"When I'm walking around campus this year I'm going to challenge people to 'turn it up.' We're going to turn it up because okay is not good enough. We have to turn it up to be phenomenal."

Very wise and poignant words, no matter if you are a student or alumni of our great College!

August 23rd saw the annual "Ringing In" ceremony in Pioneer Chapel, for the men of the class of 2018. 262 men sat in the Chapel balcony as President Hess welcomed them to the College, asking the students to strive for their fullest potential.
