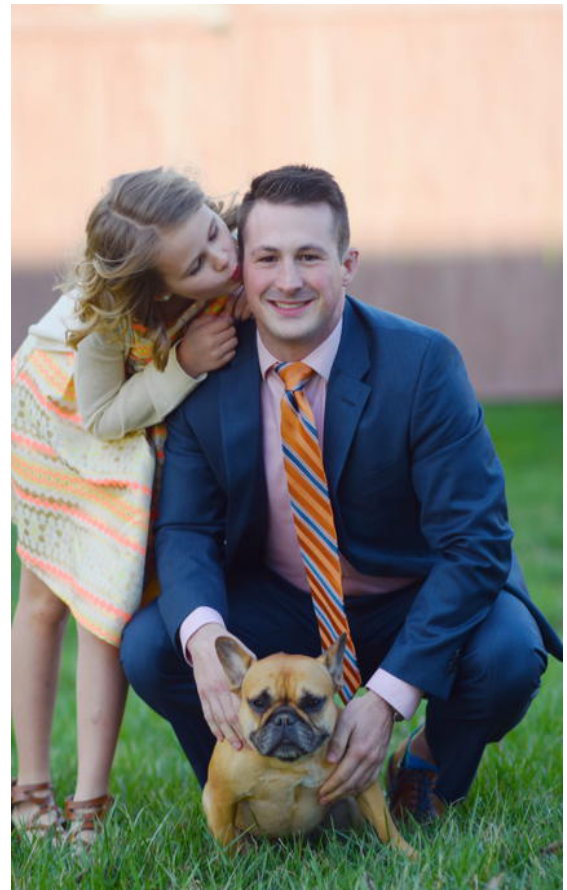


## SETH NUNAN
