

Wabash & DePauw Join Forces to Oppose HJR-6

This week President Hess and President Brian Casey of DePauw issued a joint statement in opposition of HJR-6, a piece of legislation that would constitutionally define marriage in Indiana as a union between one man and one woman.

Their statement reads, in part: "Our students come from around the country and around and world, and our fundamental goal is to educate them to think critically, exercise responsible leadership, communicate effectively, and tackle complex problems. This depends on attracting talented faculty and staff, a task that is made more difficult by the passage of this amendment. We are also engaged in the enterprise of fostering ideas and innovation, a mission which inherently depends on an environment of openness and inclusion that would be compromised should this amendment be enacted."
