## Young Alumni Symposium

During the weekend of August 10-11, the College Alumni Affairs office convened the 2<sup>nd</sup> Young Alumni Symposium. The group included members from the last eight graduating classes (2000-2007) and I served as the representative for 2002. The College is constantly trying to improve the services it provides to students and alumni and sought input from the group of 10 alums in four areas: Public Affairs, Career Services, Annual Fund, and Alumni Services.

Some of the topics we discussed include:

- Establishing permanent "@wabash.edu" email accounts for all alumni not just the permanent forwarding option currently available
- Complementing the Class Agent Letters with Class Blogs for the class agents to update more frequently with smaller pieces of information
- Focusing issues around specific areas, such as Washington, D.C. or Chicago, similar to this year's *Wabash Magazine* which focused on alumni in California
- Increasing the presence of young alumni on the website and in the publications
- Identifying ways to get young alumni more involved in the regional associations
- Increasing young alumni involvement with the Career Services office
- Raising young alumni awareness of the resources available from the Career Services office

It was a worthwhile weekend for me, as I was able to see some of the tangible improvements made to the Career Services office since we left (we can still use all of their resources). It was also interesting to hear some of the challenges facing the Public Affairs and Alumni offices in fostering relationships with young alumni. Several members of the College participated in the weekend, including President White and Chris White, Tom Runge, Mike Warren, Joe Klen, Jim Amidon, Joe Emmick, and Kyle Dunaway. They, among others, are making a conscious effort to continue to provide us with benefits after handing us the sheepskin. The best example of improvement since our time on campus is the new Director of the Schroeder Career Center, Scott Crawford. Scott has done some amazing things with the Career Services office and expects to help us out with graduate school applications and interviews, and career guidance and information.

#### Wabash Shines in National Rankings
