

Theta Delt Swims to Glory

Senior Kyle O'Keefe had a standout day in Canton, Ohio, the location of this year's North Coast Athletic Conference's swim and dive championships. He and junior Jim Leuck aided the team to their second highest point total, 1066 points, since joining the NCAC. This resulted in third place for the team at the end of the long weekend. With a 21st place finish in the 400 IM and 14th in the 100 breast stroke, O'Keefe made crucial moves to put the team in scoring position. His last event and best placing, 12th in the 200 breast stroke, was a lifetime best. Despite widespread cases of the flu, O'Keefe, Leuck, and the rest of the Wabash team were able to pummel the next closest competitor, Wittenberg, by almost three hundred points.
