Apr. 26: McCarthy '12 Wins Scholar-Athlete Award



Kevin McCarthy received the IAWM Scholar-Athlete Award, which is given each year to a senior who has combined excellence in both his scholarship and athletics.

Kevin won a National Championship in the indoor mile this spring at a meet where he was presented with an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship. He's Regional Champion in cross country, five-time All-American in the 800-meter run, 1500-meter run, 3,000-meter steeplechase, one-mile run, and cross country. He's also received multiple All-NCAC awards in cross country and indoor/outdoor track and field and was named the NCAC Men's Distance/Middle Distance Performer of the Year.

Academically, Kevin is a biology major with a 3.52 cumulative G.P.A. and minors in both chemistry and Spanish. He's the head resident assistant, President of the Wabash Acts Responsible organization (a group that promotes sportsmanship and responsible student behavior), and Manager of the College's NCAA Choices Grant. Kevin also served as a medical volunteer with both the Frontier Nursing Service in the Appalachian Mountain range in addition to service in South America.



Oct. 20-23: Moot Court

Thirty six Wabash students participated in the 19th Annual Wabash College Moot Court Competition. Riley Floyd '13 was named Top Advocate. The judges panel selected Henke over finalists Andrew Dettmer '15, Alex Robbins '13, and Michael Carper '13.



The students argued their case in front of three real judges and a Wabash College professor. The judge's panel was led by Hon. John G. Baker who has served on the Indiana Court of Appeals since 1989. He also is an adjunct professor at IU in the School of Public and Environmental affairs. Hon. Denise LaRue, a U.S. Magistrate Judge, joined the panel. This year's Moot Court problem involves the Defense of Marriage act.

A Moot Court tradition is to ask back a Wabash alum and faculty member. Hon. David Ault '70, judge of Montgomery County Superior Court 1 took his second turn at judging Moot Court. Dr. Melissa Butler, Political Science Professor, also appeared for the second time. Butler is just the second professor to be asked back in the program's 19-year history.

Moot Court was streamed live via the internet for the first time in the program's history. As in previous years, students and faculty from Lawrence North High School, joined a good student turnout in the audience.

Nov. 10: Monon Bell Stag



About 260 men of Wabash and DePauw gathered once again at the Arabian Room at the Murat Shrine for the Annual Monon Bell Stag.
