### INSTITUTE OF ISMAILI STUDIES

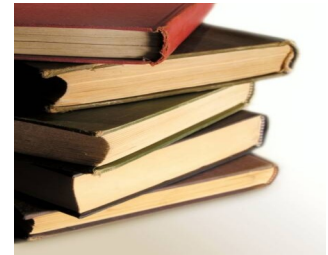

continues through September.



The exhibit came to Wabash as part of the *Big Bash* celebration in June, and was the focal point of a colloquium presented by Kelly to participating alums.
