The highlight of the program is a business simulation that allows you and your teammates to run your own business. In addition to learning the fundamentals of business, you'll receive an introduction to marketing, accounting, and advertising.

When we say "hands-on," we mean it. You will have the opportunity to use computers, make presentations, design an advertising campaign, and even record a commercial advertising your product. As a result, you will find that business is creative, challenging, rewarding, and, yes, fun!



Will I have any free time?

Absolutely! During the afternoons there are opportunities to use the Wabash athletics and computing facilities, as well as run errands in Crawfordsville. The OLAB counselors also coordinate activities like euchre, tennis, basketball, Texas hold-em, and pool tournaments, and even organize a talent show. Friday afternoon is typically "tie dye" day in preparation for the Woodstock party!

How much does it cost?

Nothing! If you are selected, you'll receive a full-tuition scholarship. This program is paid for by businesses and foundations, though students are required to provide their own transportation. Our sponsors know how important it is for you to have this experience!
