We take the health of our students seriously at Wabash. Our nationally-ranked Student Health Center is staffed with a certified Registered Nurse Monday-Friday, and a board-certified family physician visits Monday through Friday during the academic year. Incoming students are required to provide a health history using our online health records system, Magnus Health. This includes mandatory immunization records. International students must have TB testing consisting of a TB skin test or IGRA blood test.

REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENTS

- Documentation of the following childhood vaccinations:
 - Polio series (IPV or OPV)
 - MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) – two doses
 - The first dose must be given on or after the first birthday; the second dose at least 28 days later than dose #1
 - Titers may be submitted as evidence of immunity
 - Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis) – In addition to completion of the primary series, one dose within at least 10 years of enrollment date
 - Varicella (chicken pox) – two doses of vaccine OR laboratory proof of immunity for those with a history of disease
- Meningococcal ACWY (also called MCV-4) – two doses

STRONGLY RECOMMENDED FOR ALL STUDENTS

- Influenza
 - We make flu shots available for all students, staff and faculty each fall. We strongly encourage all community members to take advantage of this opportunity, to avoid flu outbreaks during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic
- HPV (human papillomavirus) – 2 or 3 doses depending on age at first administration
- Meningococcal B – two doses
- Hepatitis A – two doses
