We take the health of our students and our campus community seriously at Wabash. Our nationally-ranked Student Health Center is staffed with a certified registered nurse Monday-Friday, and a board-certified family physician visits Monday through Friday during the academic year. Incoming students are required to provide a health history using our electronic health records system, PyraMED. This includes mandatory immunization records. International students must also have TB testing consisting of a TB skin test or IGRA blood test.

REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENTS

- Documentation of the following childhood vaccinations:
 - Polio series (IPV or OPV)
 - MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) – two doses
 - The first dose must be given on or after the first birthday; the second dose at least 28 days later than dose #1
 - Titers may be submitted as evidence of immunity
 - Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis) – In addition to completion of the primary series, one dose within at least 10 years of enrollment date
 - Varicella (chicken pox) – two doses of vaccine OR laboratory proof of immunity for those with a history of disease
- Meningococcal ACWY (also called MCV-4) – two doses at least 8 weeks apart
- SARS-CoV2 (COVID)
 - Moderna: primary series of two doses given 4-8 weeks apart OR
 - Pfizer: primary series of two doses given 3-8 weeks apart OR
 - Janssen/Johnson & Johnson: one dose
 - Prior infection confirmed by PCR/NAAT test. Provide copy of test result
 - Prior infection confirmed by antigen test performed in a clinical setting such as a medical office, pharmacy, testing site (not a home test). Provide copy of test result
 - Prior infection certified by physician or advanced nurse practitioner. Provide documentation

STRONGLY RECOMMENDED FOR ALL STUDENTS

- Influenza (we make flu shots available on campus for all students and employees each fall)
- HPV (human papillomavirus) – two or three doses, depending on age at first administration
- Meningococcal B – two doses
- Hepatitis A – two doses
