#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

This past January, these eleven guys and I met to create a show. We had nothing except the desire to generate something about men's mental health. Six weeks later, we left for spring break with stories, statistics, "moments", images, sounds and a title, *Thin Walls*.

Following the break, we began meeting 15 hours a week in addition to class meetings, to build a show from the class material. What you will see tonight is the next step on the journey to participation in the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in early August.

The Edinburgh Festival Fringe is the largest international fringe festival featuring thousands of performances during the first three weeks of August. *Thin Walls* will be performed 8 times at The Fringe, allowing the students to explore other performances and the myriads of attractions in beautiful and historic Edinburgh.

The students in the THE-303 Wabash on the Fringe Immersion course have plunged themselves in a creative process that was completely unfamiliar and sometimes uncomfortable. I am immensely grateful for their willingness to collaborate, experiment, discover, learn and, sometimes, fail together.

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
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
