Complete application for admission and submit the Lilly Award application by January 5, 2020.	Based on character, creativity, and academic accomplishment. Finalists interviewed on campus February 23–24, 2020.
Honor Scholarships Up to full tuition over four years.	Apply for admission by December 1, 2019 and attend Scarlet Honors Weekend December 6–7, 2019.	Students must have a completed application by December 1, 2019. Must attend Scarlet Honors Weekend December 6–7, 2019

NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID FOR INDIANA STUDENTS

- Academically qualified Federal Pell Grant recipients, from Indiana, will receive grants to cover the balance of all tuition and fees not covered by government grants.
- Academically qualified students from families residing in Indiana, with adjusted gross incomes up to \$125,000 will receive grants to lower the Wabash tuition and fees equivalent to tuition and fees at the state's flagship university.

WABASH COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID PROCESS CHECKLIST

STEP 1

- WHAT:** **Create a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID** (one for the student, one for the parent)
WHY: FSA IDs are used to electronically sign the FAFSA
WHERE: Apply at www.fsaaid.ed.gov
WHEN: Due as soon as possible but will be necessary to submit the FAFSA

STEP 2

- WHAT:** **Complete Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**
WHY: To apply for eligible need-based financial assistance at the federal and state levels (including Federal Direct Student and Parent PLUS loans)
WHERE: Complete at <https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/>
WHEN: Available October 1, 2019 – **We recommend that students file as soon as possible. Please submit by January 15, 2020 for Wabash processing (State of Indiana Deadline is April 15, 2020)**

- Students selected as Lilly Award recipients or who receive the largest Honor Scholarship are not eligible for additional Wabash Merit-Based Scholarships/Awards. Students selected to receive more than one of the other Wabash Merit-Based Scholarships/Awards will receive the monetary value of their highest award plus a maximum of an additional \$1,000 to represent each Wabash Merit-Based Scholarship/Award of an equal or lesser monetary value.
- Wabash College is a member of the NCAA Division III. Consequently, we cannot consider a candidate's participation, ability, or leadership roles in athletics when awarding Wabash scholarships.
- Complete application for admission by March 1, 2020.
