WHY: To apply for eligible need-based financial assistance at the federal and state levels

(including Federal Direct Student and Parent PLUS loans)

WHERE: Complete at https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/

WHEN: Available October 1, 2020 – We recommend that students file as soon as possible.
