### OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS & AWARDS

**\$10,000**

**Snodell Scholarship**

In addition to Merit Scholarships for student and families from Chicago, northern Illinois, southern Wisconsin and eastern Iowa.

**\$2,000**

**Honors Scholarship**

Apply for admission and register for Scarlet Honors Weekend by December 1, 2025. Must attend Attend Scarlet Honors Weekend, December 6-7, 2025 OR February 15-16, 2026.

**Wabash College Lilly Award**

Complete application for admission and submit the Lilly Award application by January 4, 2026. Based on character, creativity, and academic accomplishment. Finalists interview February 22–23, 2026.

**\$2,000**

**\*File Your FAFSA Award**

Complete application for admission and file a FAFSA each year to maintain this award. Must be admitted to the College. No additional selection criteria.

**\$1,000**

**\*Campus Visit Scholarship**

Complete application for admission and attend any campus visit, except Scarlet Honors Weekend. Must be admitted to the College. No additional selection criteria.

Scholarships are available for four years. Amounts do not increase each year.

# Additional Scholarships & Aid

FOR FAMILIES FROM CHICAGO, NORTHERN ILLINOIS, SOUTHERN WISCONSIN AND EASTERN IOWA

- Academically qualified residents of these areas whose SAI does not exceed \$7,500 will receive grants to cover the balance of tuition and fees not covered by government grants.
- Application for admission and a FAFSA must be completed by March 1, 2026.

## WABASH COLLEGE FINANCIAL AID PROCESS CHECKLIST

### STEP 1

**WHAT: Create a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID - parent and student**

**WHY: FSA IDs are used to electronically sign the FAFSA**

**WHERE: Apply at <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account>**

**WHEN: Due as soon as possible and is necessary to submit the FAFSA**

### STEP 2

**WHAT: Complete Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**

**WHY: To apply for eligible need-based financial assistance at the federal and state levels (including Federal Direct Student and Parent PLUS Loans)**

**WHERE: Complete at <https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa>**

**WHEN: Available October 1, 2025 – Please submit by February 1, 2026 for Wabash processing.**

- Students selected as Lilly Award recipients are not eligible for additional Wabash Merit-Based Scholarships or Awards.

- For full consideration for merit scholarship, awards, and need-based financial aid, complete application for admission by March 1, 2026.
- Scholarship amounts within the ranges are determined by a holistic review of your academic achievements, including grade trend, strength of curriculum, test scores (if submitted), and class rank (if available).
