In 2024–25, we awarded \$30.6 million in academic scholarships and grants to students.

The Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) Program will provide up to three scholarships for entering Wabash freshmen each year who are chosen by the Army to participate in the ROTC program. The scholarships will cover the full cost of tuition and on-campus room and board at Wabash, as well as all costs associated with ROTC courses. The value for four-year participants is in excess of \$240,000. Students who continue in the program will receive full-ride scholarships for their remaining three years at the College.
