*For the 2020-2021 enrollment cycle, Wabash College will practice test-optional admission. Applicants are not required to submit standardized test scores as part of their application for admission.

Students who choose not to submit standardized test scores will still be considered for merit-based scholarships.

This review will place additional weight on the rigor of the applicant's high school curriculum as well as his performance in his college preparatory courses.

All standardized test score submissions will be super scored.

NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID FOR INDIANA STUDENTS

- Academically qualified Federal Pell Grant recipients, from Indiana, will receive grants to cover the balance of all tuition and fees not covered by government grants.
- Academically qualified students from families residing in Indiana, with adjusted gross incomes up to \$125,000 will receive grants to lower the Wabash tuition and fees equivalent to tuition and fees at the state's flagship university.

WHEN: Available October 1, 2020 - We recommend that students file as soon as possible. Please

submit by January 15, 2021 for Wabash processing (State of Indiana deadline is April 15, 2021)
