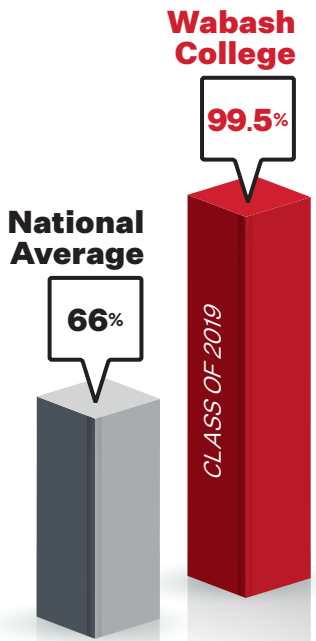

Out-earn your peers. Wabash graduates earn among the highest salaries in the nation. Have a job or be admitted to grad school before you graduate. (86% of our seniors had secured employment, fellowship, or postgraduate education before graduation. 98% by six months. The national average is 64% six months after graduation.)

Whatever your major it will be among the top-ranked programs in the nation. (All 40 Wabash degree programs rank in the top 17 percent of the nation's nearly 1,400 four-year colleges with several of our programs ranking in the top 1 percent.) International Scholarships and Aid

- Trustee International Scholarship: Two merit-based scholarship awards covering total direct cost of four-year attendance, including tuition, fees, and on-campus room and board.
- Presidential International Scholarship: Merit-based scholarships ranging from \$10,000 to \$30,000
- On-Campus Employment: All international students are eligible for WISE (Wabash Internships and Student Employment). International students will work an average of 10-16 hours per week and earn up to \$4,500 over the course of the academic year.
