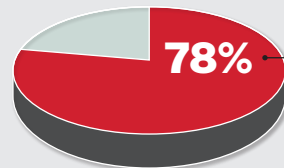

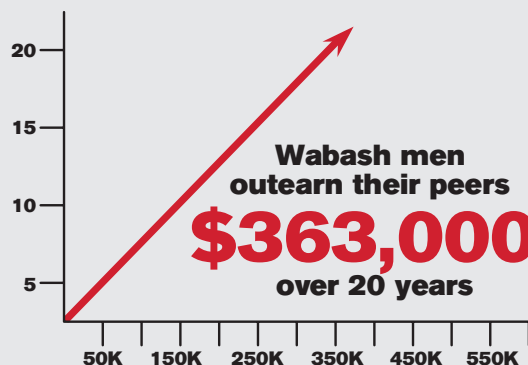

(All 40 Wabash degree programs rank in the top 17 percent of the nation's nearly 1,400 four-year colleges with several of our programs ranking in the top 1 percent.)
