

Wabash Liberal Arts Immersion The Brotherhood: Get started early

What does it mean to study liberal arts? What kind of jobs can I get when I graduate? What is expected of me in my classes at Wabash?

The Wabash Liberal Arts Immersion Program is the key to answering all these questions and more! The WLAIP is a year-long program aimed at giving you an early, in-depth look at the liberal arts and preparing you for long-term success in your academic career at Wabash.

The program begins with a one-month, on-campus experience where you will complete English 101 for credit. You and your peers will also connect with faculty, staff, upperclassmen, and alumni to familiarize you with the Wabash network and its advantages.

During the fall of your freshman year, you and your WLAIP colleagues will be invited to join alumni, faculty, and staff for networking events, designed to help you make the most of your time at Wabash and to prepare you for life after Commencement in 2024.

WLAIP continues in the spring of your freshman year as you work with Career Services staff to identify, apply for, and secure a summer immersion experience, such as a research opportunity with one of our faculty members, a business internship, or one of several academic summer immersion programs that could take you across the country or around the world.





Parents and guardians are also invited to visit campus on the first day of the summer institute on June 27th to hear from faculty and staff about the value of a liberal arts education; how they can prepare for your transition to college; what support systems are in place at Wabash to help ensure student success; and how to make sense of the financial demands of college attendance. (Financial assistance will be available to families living outside of Indiana to offset transportation costs.)

Why should I participate?

Earn credit toward your Wabash degree during the four-week Summer Institute.

Guaranteed summer internship or immersion experience in 2021.

Meet upperclassmen who will become your mentors, tutors, and most importantly, friends.

Start networking with alumni and faculty early.

Gain valuable exposure to the many resources and support systems available to all students.
