2. **Reunion Gift Chairman.** We still need someone to serve as the reunion gift chairman. He will be working with the College Advancement Office (David Troutman – [troutmad@wabash.edu](mailto:troutmad@wabash.edu), 765-361-6135) and his classmates to develop a plan for a reunion class gift. The reunion gift is presented to the College on the Friday evening of the Big Bash before all of the attendees.
3. **Reunion Book Chairmen.** The 50<sup>th</sup> reunion classes have traditionally assembled a reunion book. This book can take whatever theme the class wants it to have – recently most classes have focused on what they have been up to for the past 50 years. Many classes include a mix of pictures from their yearbooks, old *Bachelors*, etc. This book takes several months of lead time, especially if you plan to mail it before the reunion. (The book can help you generate interest and attendance if you can get it out **before** the reunion.) The Alumni office helps defray the cost of the book and provides some administrative assistance.
