New Student Center: While the USDA loan has been approved there are a number of design reviews and approvals needed before the green light can be given to begin construction on the new building. At the moment the ground is frozen anyway. From the cam picture in my last letter not much has changed. Some work is being done on the external utilities. Wabash Sports: The Wabash football team finished the season with a respectable 9-2 record, with the second loss 20-41 at the hands of DePauw in the 131st Monon Bell game. While Wabash had a good passing game they had only 32 yards rushing, in which DePauw shut down Wabash's running game. Total yards DePauw 469 to Wabash's 325. Wabash played Ohio Northern Univ Nov 22 in the Forever Lawn Bowl in Canton, OH and won 32-31. With ONU ahead 31-24 with less than a minute in the game Wabash scored a touchdown with 2 seconds left and went for 2 points to go ahead 32. A real nail biter! The basketball team is 5-3 with a win on Dec 13 over John Carroll 101-97. They have the Center College Tournament in Danville, KY Dec 29-30. The wrestling team is 1-1 and completed 3 matches with no team scoring. The swimming and diving team is 1-2 with a majority of their meets coming after the New Year.
