## **Annual Giving**

FY'23 total Annual Giving for the College once again exceeded the goal of \$3.6MM with a total \$3,858,472...the second highest Annual Fund total in the College's history. Total Alumni participation was once again over 40%. Our Class once again did very well, with a participation rate of **40.2%**...a higher participation than the past few years except for our 50<sup>th</sup> Reunion year where participation was 47%. Total Annual giving by our Class of '72 in FY '23 was **\$275,638**, given by 68 donors (out of our solicitable roll of 169 classmates). Great job to all!

Got to spend some time this summer with **Bob Ivancevich** and his charming wife Susan in Land O Lakes Wisconsin. Ivan has been instrumental in creating and running the Land O Lakes Arts Organization for many years in that area. They have a series of musical events in the summer, and for the second year in a row, he invited the rock band I play in ("Big Brother's Vinyl") to participate in the event. What a great time. Thank to Ivan and Sue for being such wonderful hosts to all of us.

I also spent some time in Indy with **Don Lawton** and his lovely wife Molly. Don is retired from dentistry, but very busy, particularly this past summer, as he and others organized a 55<sup>th</sup> Reunion celebration for our high school class from North Central High School in Indy. I visited with **Dan Grube** as well at this classy event.

I was saddened to hear from John Bridge that **Finley Campbell** passed away this last August. As many of you know, Dr. Campbell joined our Class at our 50<sup>th</sup> Reunion in 2022, and participated in most of the events involving our class. He told us all that weekend that he always referred to himself as "a member of the Class of '72".
