- In much happier news, the Class of 2025 had their Commencement on May 17. The Class of 2025 had the distinction of being recruited largely remotely because the COVID pandemic prevented many of the typical college tour activities. Both Luis Rivera III and Logan Weilbaker represented their class well with excellent speeches. - President Feller gave the Big Bash attendees an update on the status of the College. Wabash has rebounded from the challenges brought on by COVID. The incoming freshmen class will be the largest in 2 or 3 decades. Last Fall saw the biggest freshman-sophomore retention rate. The current 4-year graduation rate is 78%. The projects to replace the Sparks Center and to make campus-wide improvements to the utility infrastructure will be complete in 2 years. In summary, Pres. Feller said, "*Five years ago, long-term planning meant 'what are we going to do in 2 weeks?' Now, we are planning for the college's bicentennial in 2032!*"
