John was a proud graduate of Wabash College and Northwestern University Dental School. He served in the U.S. Air Force for two years. John had a pediatric dental practice in Elmhurst, Illinois He was also an associate professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago College of Dentistry.

After his retirement from dentistry in 1995, John worked for several years as an usher for the Arizona Diamondbacks at Bank One Ballpark, a starter at Eagle Mountain Golf Club and as a volunteer at Mayo Clinic Scottsdale. He is survived by his wife Angela. It gave John great pride to attend the college graduation of each of his grandsons and to see them become established in their careers.
