Our condolences to the family and friends of GILBERT M. SHOAF. Gil died July 4, 2018 and will be missed.

Following is his obituary:

Gilbert M. "Gil" Shoaf, 82, devoted husband of late Patricia for 50 years, passed away on July 4, 2018. Late of Schererville, formerly of Crown Point. Loving father of Dawn (Bruce) Ekblaw and Candy (Grant) Shoaf-Butler. Cherished grandfather of Evan, Emma, Erika, Bonnie, and Carlie. Fond uncle of many nieces and nephews. He was known to many as a "gentle giant". He was born in Grindstone, Pennsylvania, and son of the late Joseph and Julia (Pollak) Shoaf. Gil is survived by his brother Joseph Jr., predeceased by three brothers: Jake, James, and Bernard, and sister Genevieve. Gil was an exceptional athlete. He was a 1957 graduate of Wabash College where he played football, wrestled, and member of Phi Delta Theta. During his senior season, he was named All American and was listed as one of the great "Big Men" in Wabash football history. After graduating from Wabash, Gil was drafted by the Philadelphia Eagles and then went on to play in the Canadian Football League for the Toronto Argonauts. He was the proud owner of Gil Shoaf Enterprises. He was an inductee of the: National Sporting Goods Association Hall of Fame, SGAA Agents Hall of Fame, Nokona Hall of Fame, and Wabash College Athletic Hall of Fame. Gil volunteered numerous hours with the St. Anthony Hospital Auxiliary and St. Michaels Church. He also was a founding member of the Knights of Columbus St. Michael the Archangel Council #12177.

This note from the Shoaf family tells a nice story: His love for Wabash College and how it changed his life forever will never be forgotten, especially since he will be wearing a Wabash sweatshirt to his final resting place.
