The Red Pack, aka X Country runners, were 4th at the Butler Invitational. The guys were behind Butler, IUPUI (Indiana University-Purdue University at Indianapolis, pronounced Oowie Poowie), U of Cincinnati, WC and U. of Indianapolis. Wabash's top runner was 6th with a time of 18:43.5 for the 6000meter course.

Soccer won its first match 3-2 in OT against Franklin College. If you haven't seen the soccer stadium, it's fantastic. So are the baseball stadium and the wrestling /tennis buildings. Wabash has wonderful athletic facilities, don't you know. They are head and shoulders above those of our day.

Last years' golf, basketball and swim teams were named Academic All-Americans. GPAs of 3.2, 3.35 and 3.5 respectively. The NCAC, the league Wabash is in, honored 40 Wabash student-athletes who had a GPA of 3.5 or above. Makes you proud, doesn't it?

I received an e mail from one AnnMarie Hale of Logan, Utah, informing me that William Knoll passed away last March.
