Wabash stands tall these days and graduated 189 seniors on Mother's Day. Quite a good class and the first one to graduate that started with President Greg Hess. National recognition continues to flow especially in the area to student/faculty engagement. The student/faculty ratio is currently 10/1. 95% of the faculty has a PhD. or equivalent degree.

The Career Services office is now headed by Jacob Pactor '04. They are providing immense success with internships and mentoring; and is recognized as one of the best in the USA! Wabash men all over the country continue to engage these young men. Last year's class was 70% employed or in grad school by commencement. Six months out, 90-95% are settled. The tuition this year was \$40,014 while room & board can be as high as \$9200 in the new living units. Over 90% of students receive aid. (This is a far cry from our \$600 tuition at Wolcott & Morris @ \$250 and board \$400 per YEAR! Oh, well, I think we struggled to cover those costs quite a bit.)

A big cloud came over Indiana this year. St. Joseph College in Rensselaer announced it will close following 2017 commencement. Very sad! I remember years ago that the Chicago Bears held their summer camp at St. Joe. Not far behind may be St. Mary's of the Woods in Terre Haute. Wabash, along with Purdue and other institutions have gone to the campus to offer assistance.
