Our Alums ... are not only there with financial support (described above) BUT ALSO with "boots on the ground". Last spring, when companies (due to the challenging business environment) were announcing rescinded job offers and cancelled internships Wabash reached out to Alumni and, within 24 hours of being alerted, the Wabash community responded with 200 offers of help. You explain this to other schools and they just shake their heads in awe. A WOW MOMENT!

It is no wonder that Wabash students respond:
