Dear Classmates,

What a Fantastic 50th Reunion!!

In summary:

- "We love to sit as the shadows flit, and praise it in song and story" The campus looks great and our athletic teams are doing well; Wabash leads the nation in many measures of liberal arts education.
- "Long in our hearts we'll bear the sweetest memory of thee"
 Lots of reminiscing and reconnecting at the Big Bash and a few tears of joy (as well as some tears of sadness over missing classmates).
- "Our Prayers are always thine, our voices and hearts combine" Chapel Sing – we won again, with wonderful harmony and another creative skit!
- "Dear Old Wabash, thy loyal sons shall ever love thee"
 We set a new 50th reunion record for Class Gift of \$9.6 million and attendance of 80 classmates!

For many of us the weekend began on Thursday night, with informal small group sessions to get reacquainted, have a fraternity brother renewal, or just tour the campus and view "the classic halls".

The campus is in beautiful shape --- the new or remodeled living units are very attractive, the Shelbourne Wrestling Center and Goodrich Stadium for baseball are state of the art, and there is more green space as a result of campus expansion.

There were **several classmates who attended their FIRST** Wabash reunion. And, several who had attended only one or two. I think I'm safe in saying the sentiment was one of **"boy, I'm glad I'm back here ... like being home again".**

Of course there was **reminiscing** with dozens of stories of Operation Frijoles, Dean Moore, water/snowball/greased pole fights, and our favorite business establishments (The Strand, Tommies, Green Street Tavern, The Snacker, Rivera Motel, Bank Cigar Store, . . .). We Swept the Awards

Not only did our class sweep the awards, we set some new records!

Results:

- 1909 Attendance Award for Highest Percentage of class members attending --- 42%
- 1928 Attendance Award for largest number of men attending, with 80, which broke the old 50 year reunion record and tied the all-time record for all reunions (We needed JUST ONE MORE for a new record!)

- A new record for 50th reunion Class Gift of \$9.6 million beating the \$8.0 million record set by the Class of '66 last year

At the Sunday brunch President Hess made a brief speech on the State of Wabash. Among the points he emphasized:

- The endowment is strong, especially so in comparison to our conference and other peer institutions (Ed. note –we all know Wabash has no peers!); but more effort is being exerted to increase it for a more solid financial foundation

The 1909 Attendance Award is given to the reunion class with the highest percentage of class members in attendance. This year's winner is the Class of 1967 with 41.7 percent in attendance. Second place is the Class of 1977 with 18.4 percent and third place is the Class of 2007 with 11.1% in attendance. Clark Dickerson '67 and Duane Hile '67 are pictured with President Hess to accept the award.



The Class of 1967 won the 1928 Attendance Award for largest number of alumni present. Dickerson and Hile accepted the award.



The Robinson-Reagan Chapel Sing Award goes to the Class of 1967. Second place is the Class of 2007 and third place is the Class of 2012.



The Dorman Hughes '43 Award is given to outstanding reunion leaders. This year's winners are from the Class of 1967, Clark Dickerson, Duane Hile, and Earl Houck (not pictured).
