A graduate of Wabash College and the Columbia Journalism School, Gordy began a long career at The New York Times in 1968, where he met his wife, Nora Kerr. Among the positions he held in the newsroom were copy editor, editor of the L.I. Weekly, assistant Metro editor, Real Estate copy chief, and assistant News Technology editor. Moving to the Systems Department in 1992, he became Manager of Internet Services in 1994, after helping connect The Times to the Internet. He retired in 2001. He is survived by his son, Andrew Kerr-Thompson of NYC, and his sister, Ann T. Lynch of Las Vegas.
